Social Skills Groups For Children and Adolescents

Social skills are vital in today's world and children often need extra help developing these skills. If your child demonstrates two or more of the following characteristics, they could benefit from a group to help them make friends and develop positive social skills:

1. Prefers to spend time alone or with adults instead of classmates
2. Suffers from being bullied at school
3. Demonstrates low self-esteem
4. Wants to make friends but does not know how
5. Annoys to get attention because they do not know how to get it another way
6. Cannot maintain eye contact
7. Does not know how to resolve conflict
8. Overreacts to teasing
9. Does not understand appropriate social and physical boundaries
10. Peers do not call to hang out
